
Dear Apartment Resident,

CORONO VIRUS SAFETY ALERT: BE SAFE BAF MEMBERS!

BAF fully supports all government directives on prevention of COVID 19 outbreak and implement all measures necceassary to flatten the curve. We urge all members to be cautious and safe. Pl read our advisory on cluster groups for all information and resource sites.



The important alerts and updates for BAF members and every apartment community for the month is as under: .

- 1. On the matter of KSPCB notices, the petitions filed by BAF with members by ECC(Rs 5 lakhs) were heard and <u>orders were passed</u> <u>restraining KSPCB from initiating recovery of ECC & restraining them on any coercive action (disconnection of water/ electricity etc) to the aggrieved apartments for lack of due procedures as well. Pl do note this is relief for petitioned apartments and those who wish to contest need to be part of the petition group. These orders for not generic.</u>
- 2. The second batch of petitions on the Rs 2-3 crore penalties are also being consolidated for action. Apartment associations who have received notices from KSPCB/ BWSSB/ BESCOM on disconnection of water or electricity or UGD along with inconsistent STP treated water norms report & environmental compensation penalties, may refer to their cluster leaders/ BAF GC for further step by step actions
- 3. A BAF team <u>also met with KSPCB member secretary</u> to discuss way forward on above issues, and further <u>a day long</u> <u>stakeholder meet is planned on 4th April 2020 to sort out this looming STP & ECC issue that has adversely impacted all.</u>
- 4. BWSSB has reversed its PND charges which were imposed during June 2019, after representation from BAF. Apartments not using Cauvery water for swimming pool or landscape will not be penalized with high tariffs. However many apartments continue to get billed with partial non domestic charge. "Caveat Emptor" Do check your bills for right tariff of Dom-HR subject to stated conditions of the BWSSB Act.
- 5. Fire department (KSFES) notices & huge invoice amounts (in lakhs) for fire inspection are still being received by apartments. BAF has placed objections to the KSFES & UDD on this new high inspection tariffs. We do urge for members to respond to the notices on actions taken for fire safety and also mention the restraint on payment till this gets clarified.
- 6. BAF participated in the V**ijay Karnataka Shrunga (Development of Bengaluru) event** held on 29th Februrary at Lalbagh. The event was visited by many GoK ministers and ULB and industry representatives. It was a great platform to represent & share contribution and importance of BAF & also exchange information on how to engage better on city developmental initiatives.
- 7. A BAF team also met with **BESCOM management to seek clarification on the SRTPV policy**. This covered issues w.r.t. lacunae in policy for capex/opex, Net & Gross metering, wheeling charges, complex subsidy process under MNRE and various other approval, billing, payments and other operational issues. BAF is in touch with not only BESCOM, but also relevant industry association to ensure there is a fair policy in place for all concerned.
- 8. BAF members also attended a rally organized by Bengaluru Navanirman Party (BNP). Their apartment manifesto is available for all to review. BAF team also met with Justice Subhash Adi, Chairman, State Level committee SWM to collaborate on various issues. BAF attended the Beyond Carlton Memorial event to show support for fire safety initiatives in apartments. BAF is currently working on the proposed ward delimitation plan and will be filing some objections to the same shortly.



In the last couple of months, many apartment complexes in Bengaluru got notices from the state Pollution Control Board (KSPCB), asking them to pay a penalty of Rs 5 lakh, for discharging untreated sewage outside their premises. Many of these apartments were already running Sewage Treatment Plants (STPs), and these were functioning well as per routine lab tests that the apartments used to get done





Legalisation of properties to fetch BBMP Rs 1.200 crore

Jan 28, 2020

Once the state government issues an order to legalise unauthorised properties in the city, the Bruhat Bengaluru MahanagaraPalike (BBMP) will earn around Rs 1200 crore from the exercise. According to preliminary findings of the BBMP revenue section, there are around 3.80 lakh unauthorised sites and properties in the city. Currently, there are 19 lakh properties under the BBMP tax ambit from which a total tax of Rs 2,420 has been collected so far this year as against Rs 2,319 crore for the same period in 2018-19.


















Bengaluru's air quality inching towards danger level

Feb 26, 2020

Air Quality in the Garden City is moderately bad, according to the World Health Organization, but experts say the situation could actually be worse. The WHO's 2019 World Air Quality Report which assessed particulate matter (PM) 2.5 of top cities across the globe found that Bengaluru's annual average is 32.6 micro grams per metre cube, against the standard value of 10 micrograms per metre cube. This means that sensitive people may experience respiratory symptoms.

Needed: Activism to get BBMP to make ward-wise budgets, fix leaks

The Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP) affects every resident of Bengaluru. Most people believe that it is corrupt, inefficient and non-responsive. In response, the BBMP throws up its hands and says it doesn't have the funds to meet all of the peoples' expectations.

The Karnataka Municipal Corporations Act, in furtherance of the Constitution's Twelfth Schedule has devolved public health, education, sanitation, solid waste management, environmental protection, slum improvement, parks and playgrounds, street lighting, parking lots, bus stops, public conveniences and burial grounds to the BBMP.
